Some of this loss is attributed to the recent D8 Convention where there was a \$4,470 deficit due to several late cancellations. Hopefully the District will assist with \$2,000 otherwise the budget will be negative \$7,000.

President Dave Smith gave a presentation on a proposal from the Calgary Club that the two Calgary Gyro clubs amalgamate. The merits of the Calgary Club were described, and the concept of sharing activities were assessed with the objective assumed to be that the synergy of the members in both clubs could lead to more members joining. It also would save volunteer time if there was less duplication of efforts such as websites, bulletins, event planning etc. Consensus of those in attendance was that before a decision is made there needs to be further consultation with active members who were not at the meeting and that a trial period of a year would involve each club sharing invitations to all activities so members could become familiar with different events and make friends with gyros in the other club. The executive will now talk with the other Club.
