Calgary - Early Years Presentation

The importance of construction of Fort Calgary was explained and we heard interesting stories of Alan's grandfather Colonel James Walker who settled in Calgary where the Inglewood Bird Sanctuary now is. He had several accomplishments including the first telephone system (1884 - 30 customers); securing the present site of Victoria Park for the Exhibition Board and establishing a sawmill in Cochrane.
